Session 1	 Understanding Panel Dynamics Topics: Roles of moderator & panelists, etiquette, group conversation rules Outcomes: Students recognize structured group communication and panel formats 	
Session 2	 Research & Opinion Building Topics: Crafting informed opinions, creating expert profiles Outcomes: Students clearly present viewpoints backed by research 	





Session 3	 Group Dialogue & Civil Discourse Topics: Active listening, turn-taking, respectful disagreement Outcomes: Students engage in collaborative dialogue, even with opposing views
Session 4	 Practice Panel Simulation Topics: Assigned expert roles, mock panel discussion, feedback loop Outcomes: Students practice structured communication in a group setting
Session 5	 Final Prep Topics: Handling interruptions, smart comebacks, speaking under pressure Outcomes: Students demonstrate confidence and agility in group settings



Session 6	 Expert Panel Discussion (Competition) Topics: Full panel show simulation on trending youth topics, judged & feedback Outcomes: Students perform as confident panelists in a competitive group discussion
Session 7	 The Power of Persuasion Topics: Debate formats, stance building, debate structure basics Outcomes: Students understand the Oxford-style debate format and form simple stance-based arguments
Session 8	 Research, Reason & Rebuttal Topics: Fact-finding, logical reasoning, spotting fallacies, rebuttal techniques Outcomes: Students can construct evidence-backed arguments and identify flaws in reasoning
Session 9	Voice, Tone & Body Language Topics: Vocal projection, eye contact, gestures, stage presence



	 Outcomes: Students improve confidence and delivery during public speaking
Session 10	 Mock Debate Rounds Topics: Practice debates, timed rebuttals, peer evaluation Outcomes: Students apply all learned skills in structured debate practice
Session 11	 Final Prep Topics: Do's & Don'ts of debating, handling pressure, closing with impact Outcomes: Students demonstrate readiness for the competition format
Session 12	 Mini Debate League (Competition) Topics: Formal debate competition with peers (Oxford/Turncoat style) Outcomes: Students showcase debate mastery in a judged live setting
